Brant presented early in his CALP experience that his personal project would be to eradicate the Japanese beetle in Palisade to protect the orchards, gardens, and lawns of every citizen. He formed a working group, sourced funding to cover costs and achieved his goal of destroying the infestation that was affecting crop production. Now that is CALP leadership at its best!

PROP 16


.also named the PAUSE Act, will be placed on the 2022 ballot to be voted on by the people. If passed, the Colorado Revised Statutes concerning animal cruelty would be amended to (a) eliminate animal husbandry practices (like artificial insemination, castration and preg-checking) illegal and(b) would define a "natural lifespan" of certain livestock species on when they can be butchered after a certain amount of years (a quarter of their life as of now).

We need to be Agvocates more than ever right now!
